for Africa through contributions made at the Christmas in January party.


The chapter discussed plans to support Fayette



Congratulations to Bolivar Middle School Librarian, Deana Sain!

Deana was awarded a \$5000 dollar grant for Bolivar Middle School Library from the **James Patterson School** Libraries Grant. Deana's intent in applying for the grant was not to build the school's library but in fact, to encourage her students to build their own personal libraries by providing free books for them to keep. This grant was awarded in partnership with Scholastic. In addition to the monetary grant award, her school will also be awarded a matching grant from Scholastic in the form of point

awards. These points will be used to purchase books for classroom libraries.
